## Adobe Ultra Cs3 Virtual Sets Library

A: Adobe CS3 probably stands for Adobe® Creative Suite® Version 3 or whatever version CS3 represents. There is no change in the virtual sets. To summarize (from my memory), there were two virtual sets in earlier versions. In CS2, there were two master sets, which were called Simple and Serious. One was based on a screenshot of a blue chair, and the other was a comic book-like cartoon character. CS3 uses a similar setup, but the master sets are now called Adventurer and Survivor. In addition to the 2 virtual sets supplied with CS3, there is now a library of 32 additional virtual sets. I believe one can still purchase the old library with the older master sets. There are no new master sets to purchase. Virtual sets are designed to be used as a mask or background for an image or an image over an image. These are for comping photos. I don't believe they are designed to be used with video.
